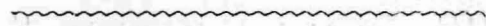

This has been home—and what a home of cheer!

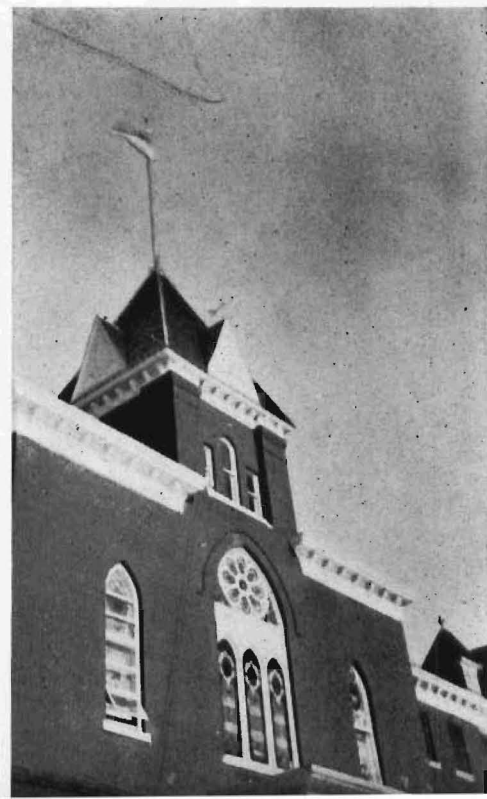

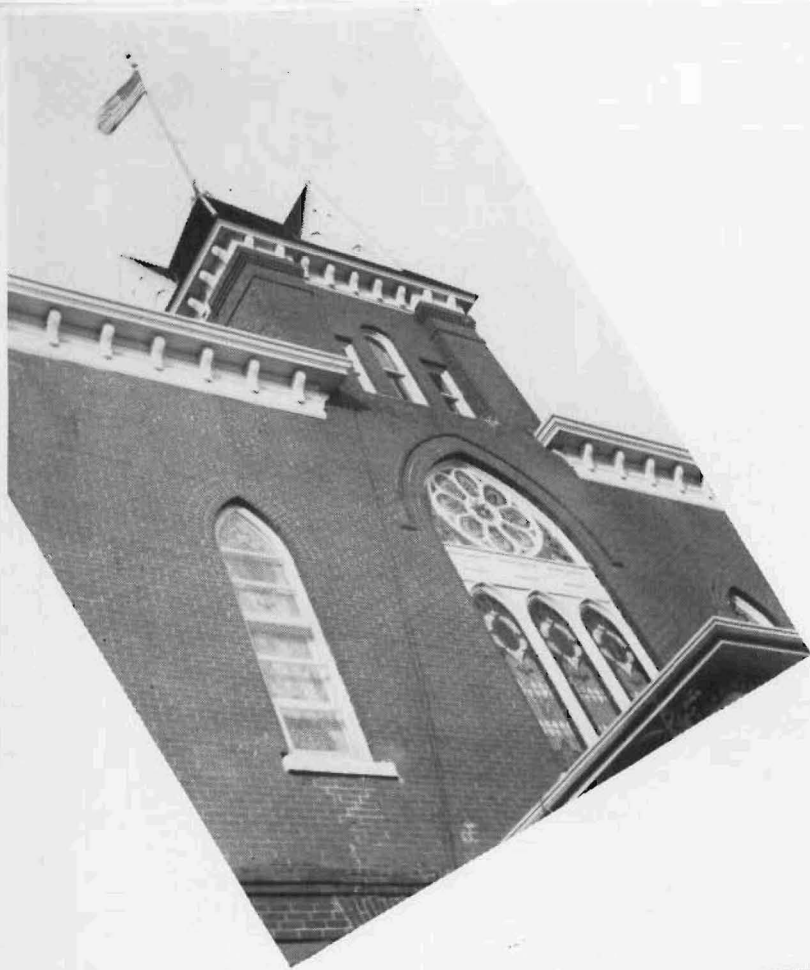
