REVIEWING THE PAST

A need, a vision, prayer, and men who dared launch out into the deep, resulted in the opening and establishing of the "Minnesota Conference School" in 1888. Thus the "seed" of Maplewood began to function under the principalship of Professor C. C. Lewis. It was conducted in the basement of the First English Church in Minneapolis where four teachers endeavored to train between eighty and one hundred students each year. Expanding roots and branches demanded more room, so a hotel building in Anoka was rented and transformed into the "Minnesota Conference School," for several years under the leadership of Professor Van Kirk as principal. At that time no thought was given to graduation exercises and the awarding of diplomas. The school was in session only a few months each winter because of the farm work, and also because of the Colporteur Institute in the spring. When students finished their courses, they took the Northern Union Conference examinations, and the regular State of Minnesota examinations. Many prominent workers in the cause of God are among those who attended this school in the early days of its history.

In 1904 the Minnesota Conference purchased a tract of land near Maple Plain, and the "Minnesota Conference School" became "Maplewood Academy." Otto O. Bernstein was the first principal. His faculty numbered five: Wavie D. Tubbs, Caroline Hopkins, Mrs. O. Bernstein, Lena Rosenthal, and H. J. Sheldon. Elder S. E. Jackson was the conference president.

Over at Hutchinson, Minnesota, a Lutheran college had been conducted for several years by Mr. Foght. This property was sold to the Seventhday Adventists for a Danish-Norwegian Seminary. In 1928 it was decided to discontinue the Seminary as a college. Maplewood Academy was therefore moved from Maple Plain to Hutchinson where the two schools were united under the name of Maplewood Academy. It became the new home, a large tree with ever-widening branches for the youth of Minnesota. Professor Alvin W. Johnson was the last principal of Maplewood Academy at Maple Plain, and the first one after Maplewood was transferred to Hutchinson.

Since the eventful year which saw the union of the two schools, many students and faculty have passed in and out of Maplewood's doors—some to service in home fields of labor, and some to carry the torch of Truth to other lands. Everywhere Maplewood's sons and daughters remember their Alma Mater, striving to uphold her standards, bringing honor and praise to her good name, thus helping to glorify the name of God in the earth.
